BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In order to consolidate enrollment and degree production, this program will merge with the degree in Interdisciplinary Studies Arts and Humanities. The new combined degree has separate concentration for arts and humanities as well as social sciences. All of the students in this degree program will be notified of the change by email and moved into the combined Interdisciplinary Studies Arts and Humanities degree.

 - The program has no faculty. All students in this degree program will be moved into the combined Interdisciplinary Studies Arts and Humanities degree and will be notified of the change by email.

 - According to FAU's Insitutitional Analysis and Effectiveness website, 44 students were awarded this degree last year: 1 Asian, 13 African-American, 9 Hispanic, 21 white; 33 women and 11 men. There are no faculty in the program.

 - There will be no impact on representation since existing students will complete through the combined Interdisciplinary Studies degree and new students will be able to pursue this track within that degree as well
