# **Civic Literacy Requirement**

Beginning in Fall 2018, students entering a Florida public institution as a degree-seeking student for the first time needs to demonstrate civic literacy through either taking a certain course (AMH 2020 or POS 2041) or passing an assessment exam. Beginning in Summer 2021, Florida Legislature amended the statute and now requires students to complete **both** a civic literacy course (AMH 2020 or POS 2041) and an assessment exam.

FOREIGN LANGUAGE (0 credits) – All students must meet the Admissions Foreign Language requirement.

**NOTE**: Honors Seminars SHALL BE ACCEPTED AS MEETING THE WRITING ACROSS THE CURRICULUM REQUIREMENT.

See the University Advising Services Office for details.

**NOTE**: See the catalog for specific requirements, course descriptions, and additional information. The requirements for some core curriculum & other courses may be satisfied by passing the appropriate AP or CLEP exam. Check with your advisor and college. Plans of study are designed specifically for each track. Students are to follow their plan of study and changes can only be made after meeting with their advisor.

The BSN degree requires 60 credits minimum of required nursing course work. For Accelerated and Traditional\* tracks, courses in the Nursing major are concentrated as upper division work after completion of all prerequisites. For the Freshman Direct Admit track, courses in the Nursing major are strategically placed throughout the four years.

\*After fall 2016, applications for the Traditional track will no longer be accepted. The College of Nursing is a limited access program and admission into Nursing is a four- step process. Please review the website - <u>http://nursing.fau.edu/</u>.

- 1. Admission to FAU (this does not mean student will automatically admitted into Nursing)
  - a. Obtain a minimum of 'C' in all prerequisite courses
  - b. Maintain minimum cumulative GPA OF 3.0.
- 2. Apply to Nursing after all prerequisites and elective requirements are met. This applies only to the Accelerated and Traditional Tracks and not the Freshman Direct Admit Track. Students must meet all University and College of Nursing requirements for graduation.

Nursing Entrance Exam Score – TEAS: This applies only to the Accelerated and Traditional Tracks and not the Freshman Direct Admit Track.

## FREE ELECTIVES (8 credits)

Free electives are courses in any college, any department, not previously taken.
