Subject: Changes to University Catalog entries for the Department of Psychology

In order to graduate, the College of Science requires that students maintain a "C" average in departmental major courses. In line with this requirement, the Department of Psychology has voted to change the minimum grade requirement to "C-" in all psychology and cognate courses taken as part of the requirements for the undergraduate degree in the Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree in Psychology, the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Neuroscience and Behavior, the minor in Psychology, and the Certificate in Applied Mental Health Services. The "C-" minimum grade requirement will apply to students admitted to the program after the changes have been updated in the university catalog. The Department requests approval for these proposed changes and requests that the program descriptions in the university catalog be updated as shown in the table below.

In addition, the Psychology Department also requests that university catalog be updated to reflect the current list of faculty associated with the program as shown in the table below.

Qualified students are strongly encouraged to become involved in neuroscience and behavior research projects (normally via a Directed Independent Study or special research course). An optional Honors Thesis, PSY 4970, is available to those students who meet the academic requirements.

Prerequisite Coursework for Transfer Students

Students transferring to Florida Atlantic University must complete both lower-division requirements (including the requirements of the Intellectual Foundations Program) and requirements for the college and major. Lower-division requirements may be completed through
