Re: Bachelor of Arts with Major in Music revised curriculum proposal

Date: November 13, 2013

The Department of Music proposes significant changes to the content of the Bachelor of Arts with Major in Music degree. Our accrediting body, the National Association of Schools of Music, advised the department that the current degree presents a strain on resources by expending significant faculty time to supervise the final year of Topic Research and Research Project, as well as deliver conducting coursework and the most advanced Music Theory class (MUT 4311 Orchestration).

The Bachelor of Arts degree is not perceived by the field or NASM as a professional degree as is the Bachelor of Music degree with Performance Concentration, or the Bachelor of Arts in Music Education. We believe that the removal of the professional coursework from the Bachelor of Arts in Music degree strengthens our other offerings by not being perceived by students as a "light" version of the professional degrees. Students will not be allowed to enroll in the Commercial Music minor while in this degree, as it would in effect turn it into a "light" version of the Bachelor of Music in Commercial Music: Music Business Concentration.

The new curriculum better fits the standards set by NASM for Bachelor of Arts degrees, and we believe this will be an asset to the university and college by allowing students to pursue a music major in a liberal arts context, and it may allow students to double-major if they choose to do so. By removing the conducting and final music theory coursework, it allows us to retain the integrity of the professional degrees while offering students more flexibility in coursework outside of the department.

Candidates for this degree will have to meet all entrance and exit requirements currently in place for all music majors in all degrees (audition, piano proficiency, etc.)

Current curriculum: 120 credits (121 for vocal majors)
