**SUBJECT: APPROVAL OF FAU'S GENERAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM**

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### PROPOSED COMMITTEE ACTION

Request for approval of FAU's revised general education curriculum and course options.

### BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The State of Florida enacted Senate Bill 266 in May 2023, which established widespread changes to higher education throughout the state, including general education standards and subject areas at all public universities and state colleges. Upon its authorization, Sections 1007.25 and 1007.55 of Florida Statutes established that the Board of Governors (BOG) would revise Regulation 8.005 General Education Course Options, including core course options and new standards, which occurred following recommendations from the state's Articulation Coordinating Committee (ACC) in October 2023 and full Board of Governors approval in January 2024.

As a result of these changes at the state level, Florida Atlantic University has now revised all general education state core course descriptions and updated student learning outcomes following its standard faculty governance curricular processes. The University has reported to the state's Office of K-20 Articulation all changes to description and outcomes of core courses following the statewide course description provided in the Statewide Course Numbering System.

Additionally, the University has prepared a revised list of general education core course options for consideration by the FAU President and FAU Board of Trustees in line with procedures outlined in BOG Regulation 8.005. The proposed list comes with positive recommendations from FAU's Core Curriculum Committee, the Undergraduate Programs Committee, the Faculty Senate Steering Committee, and the full University Faculty Senate.

The changes also impact the Harriet L. Wilkes Honors College, which has a distinct general education program that aligns with both the new state standards and the university's overall requirements.

According to the revised statutes and regulation, this is the first run of what is now an annual process. Each year, Trustees and the President will review these course options and submit approval to the ACC by September and to the BOG by December each calendar year.

## IMPLEMENTATION PLAN/DATE

Upon approval by the President and Board of Trustees at this public meeting, the University will update the University Catalog with the attached revised language, noting that FAU's existing general education program – the *Intellectual Foundations Program (IFP)* – is to be replaced by the approved curriculum. The implementation will take place in two phases. The changes to the general education *state core* course options are effective beginning Fall 2024 and are not related to a student's catalog year. The changes to the *institutional requirement* course options are effective beginning Fall 2025.

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The changes to general education will follow standard budgetary procedures, in which the Office of the Provost coordinates with impacted College Deans, the Dean of Undergraduate Studies, and their designees to monitor enrollment pipelines, changes in other state or university requirements, and trends in student demand to ensure general education instruction is adequately scheduled and funded.

## General Education Changes

- Following the 2023 Legislative session, the State of Florida revised its statutes and regulations regarding general education
- SB 266 established new standards and BOG Reg 8.005 revised course options for general education at public universities and state colleges
- Each President and Board of Trustees must now review course options
- With Board of Trustees approval, the University will annually submit its revised list of courses that meet general education requirements
  - to the State Articulation Coordinating Committee by September and
  - to the Board of Governors for consideration by December



## General Education Changes

- FAU followed standard faculty governance processes to revise courses and the proposed list of general education course options
- The proposed list comes with positive recommendations from FAU's Core Curriculum Committee, the Undergraduate Programs Committee, the Faculty Senate Steering Committee, and the full Senate
- Courses now align with new state descriptions, course-specific student learning outcomes, and updated subject areas
  - e.g. – Communication courses in the State Core have been revised to ensure students engage in public speaking and Humanities courses in the State Core include the Western canon

## Implementation Timeline

### Fall 2024: Group A - General Education Core

- Courses revised to align with new standard descriptions and student learning outcomes
- 4 primary changes
  - Math Pathways – Mathematical Thinking in Context to replace Math for Liberal Arts
  - Social Science – American History Prior to 1877 moving to Group A
  - Social Science – Sociological Perspectives moving to Group B
  - Natural Science – Geology and Oceanography moving to Group A

### Fall 2025: Group B - Institutional Courses

- Realigned to fall under new subject areas
- Revised to meet statutory course descriptions for those subject areas

The current program will be replaced with "FAU General Education Program." The statute requires that beginning Fall 2024, students must complete at least one course from each of the 5 general education core subject areas. These are Communication, Humanities, Math, Social Science and Natural Science. The previous IFP foundation distribution areas were renamed and reorganized per state regulations. The changes to the General Education core will go into effect for summer 3 term.</p> <p>The General Education Institutional requirements list commonly known as "Group B" at FAU will be reviewed by the Board of Trustees (June 2024), Articulation Coordinating Committee (August 2024), and the Board of Governors (November 2024) and annually thereafter, prior to going into effect in Fall 2025. According to statute, "An institution may not require a student to take an additional course to meet a subject area requirement that was already completed by the student with a course that has since been removed as a general education course." As before, students must still complete a minimum of 36 credit hours to satisfy their general education requirement. Credit hour requirements for core subject areas will remain unchanged with 6 credits from each of the 5 subject areas and flexibility to complete the remaining 6 credit hours in Humanities, Social Science, or Natural Science.</p>

## FAU'S GENERAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM

(for students matriculating in fall 2024 and later)

The general education curriculum is designed to ensure that every undergraduate student graduates as an informed citizen through participation in rigorous general education courses that equips students with the academic tools they will need to succeed, not only as undergraduates in their degree programs, but also as responsible citizens in a complex world.

Students must complete a minimum of 36 credit hours of general education coursework. This requirement includes a minimum of 15 credit hours mandated by the State of Florida General Education Core and up to 21 credit hours of General Education Institutional requirements, distributed as indicated in five subject areas.

Students who enter FAU without an Associate in Arts (A.A.) degree from a Florida state school must fulfill the University's general education requirements. A course may be used to simultaneously satisfy a general education curriculum requirement and a requirement of the student's major program. All course selections should be made in consultation with an academic advisor.

For students who enter FAU holding the Associate in Science (A.S.) degree from a Florida public community or state college: The Associate in Science degree prepares students for entry into employment, but it is also a transfer degree and basis for admission to a related baccalaureate degree program at FAU. Courses taken as part of the Associate in Science degree at a Florida public community or state college to meet the general education requirements will transfer and apply toward the thirty-six (36) general education credits required for the baccalaureate degree at FAU. Since Associate in Science degrees typically require 15 credits of general education coursework, students must complete the remaining credits of general education coursework at FAU.

General education core courses implement the required principles, standards, and content in accordance with section 1007.55, Florida Statutes. Each general education core course option contains high-level academic and critical thinking skills and common competencies that students must demonstrate to successfully complete the course. Prior to the award of an associate in arts or baccalaureate degree, a student entering a state university as a first-time-in-college student in the fall term 2015 and thereafter must complete at least one course from each of the general education subject areas listed in this section.

## I. Communication

(6 credits required; a grade of "C" or higher required in each course)

Communication courses afford students the ability to communicate effectively, including the ability to write clearly and engage in public speaking.

Students who complete the Communication requirement will be able to:

1. Demonstrate effective written and oral communication skills by exhibiting the control of rhetorical elements that include clarity, coherence, comprehensiveness and mechanical correctness;
2. Analyze, interpret and evaluate information to formulate critical conclusions and arguments;
3. Identify and apply standards of academic integrity.

### Thematic Clusters Option for the Intellectual Foundations Program

Thematic clusters are groups of general education courses selected to address specific themes, such as Climate Change or Evolution, or particular topics or experiences, such as Global Studies or Research and Inquiry. Students can satisfy a portion of their required general education coursework while completing a theme that is of personal or professional interest. Enrolling in an IFP thematic cluster affords students an opportunity to study the topic in-depth from multiple disciplinary perspectives and methods of inquiry. Students gain knowledge and skills related to their intended field of study while acquiring an understanding of the connections among multiple disciplines. In addition, these courses can often be used to satisfy multiple requirements (e.g., major, general education, electives).


Students who wish to enroll and complete a thematic cluster should be aware of the following:

- Thematic clusters involve between 3-6 general education courses.

- Completing a thematic cluster does not fulfill a student's entire general education requirement. Students must complete any additional required courses outside those taken in the theme.
- Not all sections of a specific general education course may be applicable to the thematic cluster. Students must be sure to select the section designed for their theme. Students should consult with their advisor if they are unsure.
- Thematic cluster courses must be taken at FAU to apply.
- Enrollment in thematic cluster courses is very limited and on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Some thematic clusters do not work for particular majors. Consult with an advisor in University Advising Services (UAS) before choosing a thematic cluster or enrolling in thematic courses.

## THE HONORS GENERAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM

The Honors General Education Curriculum is designed to ensure that every undergraduate student graduates as an informed citizen through participation in rigorous general education courses that equip students with the academic tools they will need to succeed, not only as undergraduates in their degree programs, but also as responsible citizens in a complex world.

Students must complete a minimum of 36 credit hours of general education coursework. This requirement includes a minimum of 15 credit hours mandated by the State of Florida General Education Core and up to 21 credit hours of General Education Institutional Requirements, distributed as indicated in five subject areas.

General Education Core Courses implement the required principles, standards, and content in accordance with section 1007.55, Florida Statutes. Each general education core course option contains high-level academic and critical thinking skills and common competencies that students must demonstrate to successfully complete the course. Prior to the award of an associate in arts or baccalaureate degree, a student entering a state university as a first-time-in-college (FTIC) student in the fall term 2015 and thereafter must complete at least one course from each of the general education subject areas listed in this section.



## I. Communication

(3 credits required-ENC1101; a grade of "C" or higher required)

Communication courses afford students the ability to communicate effectively, including the ability to write clearly and engage in public speaking.

As part of the Wilkes Honors College's writing-intensive curriculum, students must take four Writing Across the Curriculum (WAC) courses. WAC courses are discipline-based courses students may use to satisfy other core or concentration requirements. They are designated as WAC because they provide special attention to the writing and revision process. In most cases, the Honors Thesis will count as two WAC courses. WAC courses satisfy the State's Gordon Rule writing requirement. ENC 1101 is taken as one of the four WAC courses.

Students also submit a writing portfolio, which is a mid-career assessment of their writing at the end of their sophomore year, conducted by a committee of faculty. The writing portfolio consists of the student's Forum paper (which the Dean's office keeps on file) and at least one essay submitted to the Dean's office. This essay must meet the following four requirements:

1. It was written in the first or second year at the Wilkes Honors College;
2. It should be a scholarly essay that demonstrates the student's ability to incorporate evidence from secondary sources and/or analyze a primary text;
3. It should include the professor's comments, if possible; and
4. It should be at least five pages in length.
