

Master's Degree in SPECIAL EDUCATION with **AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER**



THE PROGRAM

The **Master's Degree in Special Education** with a concentration in **AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER (ASD)** is a fully online graduate degree, which can be completed in as little as 16 months. The rich curriculum provides foundations and specialized training to work with children and adults with an ASD diagnosis across a variety of school and community settings. Students completing this program and additional certification requirements, are eligible to apply for the State of Florida teaching endorsement in Autism Spectrum Disorder.

How to **APPLY**

APPLICATION

To be considered for admission into the Master's program in the Department of Special Education, applicants must complete a graduate application online through FAU's Graduate College at <https://www.fau.edu/graduate>; select M.Ed. in Special Education.

Students are admitted for Fall (August) or Spring (January) entry. Application deadlines for fall entry: February 15 (International); or July 1 (Domestic). Spring semester entry: July 15 (International) or November 1 (Domestic).

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Domestic Applicants

- Bachelor's Degree
- An undergraduate Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.0 or if GPA is below 3.0, applicants may submit 1 letter of recommendation from (education related field) employer or current/former university instructor
- Personal statement not exceeding three double spaced pages, indicating applicant's reasons for pursuing a Master's degree and career goals

International Applicants

- Bachelor's Degree (w/course-by-course evaluation of international transcripts if applicable)
 - An undergraduate GPA of at least 3.0 or if GPA is below 3.0, applicants may submit 1 letter of recommendation from (education related field) employer or current/former university instructor
 - Personal statement not exceeding three double spaced pages, indicating applicant's reasons for pursuing a Master's degree and career goals
 - Have attained minimum English proficiency scores within the last two years: TOEFL 500 (paper-based test), or 213 (computer-based test), or 79 (Internet-based test); a score of at least 6.0 on the IELTS; or, Duolingo 110.
- Complete Graduate College applications are forwarded to the Department of Special Education for a decision.**
