



The Six Phases of Appreciative Advising



Recognizing the importance of first impressions and creating a safe and welcoming

Utilize generative open-ended questions to draw out what others enjoy doing, their strengths, and their passions. Listen to each answer carefully before asking the next positive question.

Help others formulate a vision of what they might become, and then assist them in developing life and career goals.

Help others devise concrete, incremental, and achievable goals.



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


- Work with first- and second-year students at a public four-year university.













- First Impression

- Humor (humour if you're fancy)












