- 4) Shared information of changes to the SOA's +1 master's program (will allow for non-ASP students to join)
- **5)** Other items: For spring: a rep for A&L (we have already identified someone from Theater and Dance). For spring: a rep for the WHC (asked M. Harrawood to ask)
- 6) Dean Meeroff shared the following information:
 - Steering committee plans to propose a template for changes to Gen Ed requests; all Gen Ed courses Simple Syllabi are due 20 November. Important to look at closely: Course description (because there may be changes based on BoG guidelines) Textbook adoption (45 days before term starts and a textbook adoption attestation from BoG; FAU has been flagged because we do not have 100% completion), Learning outcomes (must be added manually), Course grading scale (different on Canvas and Simple Syllabus—ensure yours is consistent throughout the three possible versions), Al language (an option must be selected and the Al committee will look at what professors have been selecting and act accordingly), Resources (soon, faculty will be able to customize), Course topical outline (review and make necessary changes). Gen Ed revisions will occur annually. No moratorium on new course proposals for the Gen Ed.
