#### Dr. Cheryl Krause-Parello and Colleagues Awarded PCORI Grant to Study Veteran-centered Chronic Pain Research

According to the Dept. of Veterans Affairs, chronic pain is a serious health and societal concern in the U.S. affecting 40-70% of veterans, making it one of the leading causes of disability and creating significant negative impacts upon the lives of millions of veterans. Dr. Cheryl Krause-Parello and her colleagues from Rutgers, Ohio State, Rush, Augusta, Duke, and George Mason universities, are studying chronic pain and working to find solutions for veterans. They were awared a \$250,000 Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI) grant to study "Veterans Action League 2.0: Developing a National Veteran-centered Chronic Pain

Research Agenda."

The veteran population may pose greater challenges to treat based on military history and injury. Pain-reducing medication, like opioids, are a common treatment. "This project moves away from 'Take two asperin and call me in the morning,' giving veterans an active voice in chronic pain management and treatment options," said <u>Dr. Cheryl Krause-Parello</u>, Professor, College of Nursing, and Faculty Fellow, I-HeAL.

Veteran Action League Units will be established in 4 states—serving as a national research platform—where veterans and stakeholders share opinions, challenges, and barriers in managing and treating chronic pain, research ideas for improving pain management and treatment, and ways veterans want to participate in and receive findings on Patient-Centered Outcomes Research (PCOR) and Comparative Effectiveness Research (CER).
