## Preceptor Selection General Guidelines – Individual Concentrations May Have Additional Requirements

Preceptor selection is critical to student success in all Master's concentrations. Preceptor candidates must be approved by faculty and meet the following qualifications:

- Earned Graduate degree (preferably in nursing)
- National certification in their specialty area (preferred but not required for all concentrations; Required for NP concentrations)
- 2 years experience

Additional qualities of the preceptor should include:

- Passion for nursing
- Enthusiasm for coaching and/or mentoring others
- Patience when working with nurses new to roles

## Clinical Site Selection General Guidelines – Individual Concentrations May Have Additional Requirements

The agencies and institutions for advanced nursing practice experiences in the Master's program are selected according to the following criteria:

- 1. The health care philosophy and objectives of the agency or institution are compatible with those of the College of Nursing and learning needs of the students.
- 2. The accreditation status of the agency (if appropriate) is satisfactory.
- 3. The demographics of clients and advanced nursing situations are adequate to fulfill course objectives.
- 4. The educational preparation and experience of the preceptors meets required criteria for the specific course.
- 5. The location of the agency/institution is accessible.
- 6. Use of the agency by other nursing programs does not create negative learning opportunities for students.

**PLEASE NOTE:** When the university is officially closed and during semester intersessions (the period between semesters), students **MAY NOT** participate in practicum experiences.
