
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Resource for enhancing teaching practices -The Association of College and University Educators (ACUE) offers FAU instructors fully online courses (micros)



- Florida Atlantic University is continuing its partnership with <u>The Association of College and University Educators</u> (ACUE) to offer fully online micros or courses that put faculty on the path to earn a **Certificate in Effective College Instruction**, the only college teaching credential endorsed by the American Council on Education (<u>ACE</u>).
- The time commitment is 2-3 hours per week per course or micro; each micro runs for 7 weeks. Completion of ACUE micros or courses can be noted in your Annual Evaluation for teaching.
- Faculty need to complete four discrete micros to receive the ACUE certificate. Recipients of the certificate will receive an ACUE pin and will be acknowledged for their achievements by the provost's office in a special Pinning Ceremony celebration held annually at the beginning of spring semester.
- ACUE curriculum: to receive ACUE certification, faculty need to complete the micro or course—**Designing Learner Centered**Courses plus three additional discrete ACUE micros:
- -- Creating a Productive Learning Environment (either in your face-to-face courses or online)
- --Promoting Active Learning (either in your face-to-face courses or online)
- --Inspiring Inquiry and Preparing Lifelong Learners (either in your face-to-face courses or online)

Efficacy of ACUE courses or micros

- "The ACUE courses have had a significant impact on my students. They have even given me feedback about how much they enjoyed a new activity/technique I implemented. I am also more confident as a teacher, and my passion for teaching has only grown stronger."

- To date, 384 FAU faculty members have completed at least one ACUE micro, and 138 have earned full ACUE certification (completion of four discrete micros)
