The proposed research will adapt, implement, and longitudinally evaluate the clinical, service, and implementation outcomes of an innovative preventative mental health services intervention for new relative and non-relative foster parents to help them better address the mental health symptomatology of children in foster care who demonstrate significant mental health concerns and have been exposed to trauma. This preservice behavioral parent training research will also address multiple gaps in the quality, level of empirical support, potential for scalability and sustainability, and understanding of what foster parents need prior to fostering in order to maintain their own mental well-being. This research is relevant to Obj. 4 of the NIMH Strategic Plan to strengthen the quality of existing health services, as it targets preservice foster parent training as means of addressing foster child and foster parent mental health. This project will provide systematic guidance in rapidly moving from design and selection of the elements of the antiracism training (Exploration, Preparation: Aim 1 of the project) to implementation (Aim 2 of the project) and prepare for future Sustainment and development of the implementation guide and train-the-trainer manual (Aim 3 of the project). Specifically, this mixed methods

research will include a quasiexperimental feasibility trial of antiracism training to examine whether the training improves providers' racial equity knowledge, skills, and values at pre/post training and results in initial positive clinical outcomes and service outcomes for children and families.

Current preservice foster parent training research demonstrates limited effectiveness and common training curricula lack rigorous, longitudinal evaluation; thus, this study will incorporate rigorous methods to address prior deficits. This research is relevant to Obj. 4 of the NIMH Strategic Plan to strengthen the quality of existing health services, as it targets preservice foster parent training as means of addressing foster child mental health; additionally, this research will develop novel practices through more rigorous analysis and exploration of tailoring methodology. This project will be overseen by PI Dr. Morgan Cooley.

The outcomes of this project will produce points of intervention for training and supporting volunteer advocates to better represent the best interests of foster children which will enhance child permanency outcomes and well-being. Cross-sectional data analyses will be employed to examine baseline correlates of well-being of youth in transracial foster placements compared with inracial placements. Longitudinal data analysis will be used to examine outcomes over time. Given the disproportionate number of youth of color in foster care, this research is critical to ensuring that we know what aspects of youth context and family placements promote optimal child well-being, and successful transition into adulthood.
