 - Updates to General Education to comply with BOG Regulation 8.005 were approved by the UFS Steering Committee. This action was taken in accordance with the bylaws, which grant the UFS Steering the authority to act on behalf of the Senate on time-sensitive issues.

• Textbook Regulations and Data Requests, Kim Dunn

 Dr. Dunn provided update on three separate issues related to textbooks and data requests.

12. Open Forum with the Provost

- Updates on the following were provided by Provost Ivy:
 - Enrollment and Retention Update
 - 4,232 first-time-in-college students, including summer pathway students.
 - 2,557 transfer students, reflecting a 4% increase.
 - An improved retention rate of 84.49%, the highest to date.
 - A total student population of 31,615, the largest in FAU's history.
 - Financial Aid Support
 - Addressed concerns about financial aid issues, mentioning the establishment of an FAU Cares account, which assisted 449 students with over \$420,000 in aid.
 - o International Student Enrollment
 - Noted a continuing international student population of 1,897, with over 1,100 from study group programs.
 - Rankings and Recognition
 - 41st in Washington Monthly for social mobility and research.
 - Notable placements in Wall Street Journal rankings and Forbes' top colleges.
 - Al Initiatives
 - Discussed ongoing efforts to address AI in education, including a dedicated website with resources and policy considerations.
 - Accreditation Updates
 - Confirmed the completion of the SACSCOC accreditation process, with reaffirmation expected in December.
 - Plans to apply for HLC accreditation are underway, with the current SACS reaffirmation set for 10 years.
